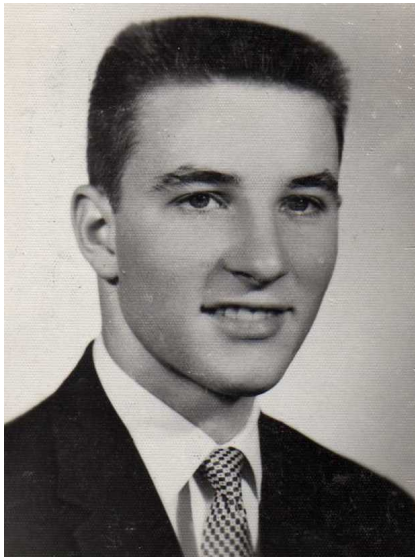

Calvin L. Ellis '59

Having a winning experience early in life provides a young man with a huge competitive advantage. It was just such an experience CHS Coach Dick Boyd made possible for Cal. Under his coach's tutelage Cal played on 16 consecutive championship baseball teams and was considered one of the top shortstops in Ohio.

He carried this winning tradition to Kenyon College, where he was captain of his team and one of the leading players in the Ohio Conference. In 1961 Cal and his CHS teammate, Joe Adkins became the first Kenyon baseball players in the school's history to garner All-Ohio Conference honors.

A student leader at Kenyon, he chaired the Student Judicial Board and was chosen to Kenyon's honorary six-man Senior Society that served as liaison between the student body and the Kenyon faculty and administration. Also a true scholar-athlete, Cal was selected to Phi Beta Kappa and became a two-time Fulbright fellow.

In 1964 he embarked on an 11-year odyssey in Southeast Asia. He worked in several different capacities – teaching, international development, public relations, refugee relief administration, education administration, and journalism – and developed a linguistic familiarity with ten foreign languages.

He founded his own news agency and was working as a foreign correspondent in Vietnam on the eve of the country's collapse in April, 1975, when he was evacuated on the next to the last airplane out of Saigon.

Returning home, he supported the refugee resettlement movement then transitioned into a 36-year career in information technology. He holds a master's degree from the University of Virginia and has been instrumental in winning more than \$287 million in business for his companies.

He was an Olympic torch-bearer during the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics and was one of the top masters' milers in the Washington, D.C. area during his early 40s. Cal coached Little League for ten years, helping nine young men attend Division 1 universities on baseball scholarships.

In 1989, Cal married Judith Kilmartin of San Francisco. They live in Reston, Virginia. He was nominated by former teammate Ace Elsea and is delighted to follow his mentor and role model, Coach Boyd, into the Hall of Fame.



Larry C. Schieber '76

The line of customers at the pharmacy's counter hints at a successful business plan -- a plan that had its beginning in the thoughts and dreams of a nine-year-old.

Larry Schieber remembers going to work with his pharmacist father in the 1960s. "He found things to keep me busy," recalls Schieber of his afternoons spent at Bingman Drugs. "Mostly stocking shelves or cleaning, but I was nine and it was fun."

Schieber, a 1976 Circleville graduate, doesn't recall a time since when he didn't want the same career as his father and to work one-on-one with customers.

Despite the lure of jobs in industry and chain stores, Schieber's goal was to open a retail pharmacy in Circleville. "My family was here, Kim's was here, and it made sense," he said. "It's also a place where one person can make a difference." In 1989, the couple opened their own pharmacy.

Schieber has been involved in numerous community and civic roles and last year stepped down as president of the Ohio Pharmacists Association. Instrumental in a local initiative to curb costly hospital re-admission rates, he also is helping develop a statewide program in conjunction with Ohio State University to increase awareness among high school students of prescription drug misuse and abuse.

Looking back, he credits former high school teachers Dannie Fouts and Lois Heffelfinger for keeping his career goals intact. "Mr. Fouts took care to ensure students progressed as a class, with no one falling behind" said Schieber of his algebra teacher. "That's a valuable lesson in itself."

Heffelfinger, with a low tolerance for mediocrity, pushed Schieber to excel in the sciences. "When I was having trouble in college with freshman chemistry she never hesitated to help. She didn't give up on her students."

Larry and his wife Kim have two sons. They are all Circleville graduates; Kim in '75, Scott in '01 and Mark in '04. He was nominated by Terri Strawser Carter '78.



Brad Fox '81

“A coach’s dream” describes Brad’s high school football career as guard for the Circleville Tigers. Dave Truex who coached the class of ‘81 as freshmen said Brad is the smartest athlete he has ever coached. In turn, Brad credits coaches Truex, Larry Cook and Brent Bell for the work ethic and discipline that has proven “valuable when facing challenges”.

When nominated by his mom, Jo Ann Fox in 2013, she said, “Brad has taken advantage of the

educational foundation developed in the Circleville City Schools to excel in his undergraduate education, graduate education, and his career.”

Circleville teachers instilled a fundamental understanding of courses, which Brad said better prepared him to tackle more advanced topics. College peers may have had more advanced courses, but he was better prepared with help from Mrs. Heffelfinger for Chemistry and Ms. Gerbeth for advanced math.

Brad received his bachelor’s degree in Materials Engineering at Virginia Tech in 1985 with an award for engineering excellence. His doctorate degree in materials science was obtained from the University of Virginia in 1990 with an award for best dissertation in the physical sciences at U Va.

He was a staff engineer at IBM for two years then senior research scientist at Kobe Steel until 1999. He then worked as technology leader and manager at GE until 2003. He is currently the Associate Dean, Masters Programs in the Pratt School of Engineering at Duke University.

Brad has been awarded five patents, written over 25 articles and contributed to three book chapters. In 2013, he was honored by the Technology Management Council of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) as its Educator of the Year.

He is married to Lynn Fox and they live in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. She is a professor at UNC-Chapel Hill. They have two children, Elizabeth who is a sophomore studying Mechanical Engineering at the University of Rochester and Emily who is a sophomore in high school at Carolina Friends School. His brother Rick also graduated from Circleville High School in 1979.

Scholarships
